I am pleased o inform you that at its meeting on March 2023, the New England Commission of Higher Education ok the following action with respect to Bridgewater State University

that Bridgewater State University be continued in accreditation;

that the institutionsubmit an interim (fifth-year) reportby August 15, 2027 roconsideration in Fate 2027;

that, in addition to the information included in all interim response to its success in:

1. developing and i

3. continuing toassess th€ore Curriculum;

that the next comprehensive evaluation be schedule tafb2032.

The Commission gives the following reasons for its action.

Bridgewater State University is continued in accreditation because the Commission finds the institution to be in compliance with the Standards for Accreditation.

The Commission commends Bridgewater State University (BSBridgewate) for its thorough and wellwritten selfstudy.

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"significantly enhance the continuous improvement progress for academic programs." Despite a decline in total undergraduate FTE enrollment from 8,288 in Fall 2018 to 7,071 in Fall 2021, the University remains in "atrong financial position with "\$56 million in cash and equivalents and \$45 million invested in the pooled endowment." Commission appreciates that the COVID-19 pandemic has had an impacter mollments at BSU's of campus locations, and we are gratified to learn that the University is exploring "alternative and synergistic approaches" to ensure effective use of these instructional sites it is long-serving and dedicated leadership, committed and caring faculty and staff, and a deeply engaged student body, Bridgewater State University is emploied to continueits mission to strive "to transform lives and improve the human condition" well into the future.

Commission policy requires anterim (fifth-yea) report of all institutions on a decennial evaluation cycle. Its purpose is to provide the Commission an opportunity to appraise the institution's current status in keeping with the Policy on Periodic Review. In addition to the information included in all nerim reports Bridgewater State University is asked, in Fall 2027, to report on three matters relate to our standards on Planning and Evaluation; Students; Teaching, Learning, and Scholarship; and Academic Program.

We understand that BSU has "largelympletedmplementation of its 2018 Strategic Plan"1.0 and is well underway in the evelopment of Strategic Plan 2, Scheduled to be completed in 2023. At "the heart" of bth the current and the future SU strategic plan is "the importance of racial justice" and the Iniversity "will aim squarely at infusing focus on the uity agenda at all levels." We further note with favorthat "nested" divisional and departmental priorities were developed concurrent with the strategic plan ensure alignment throughout the University and that BSU plans to utilize its datadashboard reated through Tableau to track and assess progress towards the plarge als and objectives. The Fall 2020 term (fifth-year) report will provide the institution with an opportunity to update the Commission success in implementing the Strategic Plan 2.0. We are guided here by our standard on Planning and Evaluation:
